To Mr. Wilmering, Jr.:

We have reviewed your project, submitted on your behalf by Govero Land Services, regarding your expansion project at the existing Arnold Rifle and Pistol Club. The project consists of adding additional ranges and a trail to the north of the existing facilities. Based on a review of historic aerial photos and the USGS maps, it appears that no impacts will occur to any drainage features located within the site. Since the current project does not include grading, filling, or dredging operations within stream channels or wetlands, a Section 404 permit is not required.


The project is located within the north half of Section 12, Township 41 North, Range 5 East, Jefferson County, Missouri. The approximate geographic coordinates of the site are 38.3060 north, -90.4096 east.

Based upon review of the project activity description we have determined that **this activity does not require a Department of the Army Permit**. If additional infrastructure plans are developed that include impacts to Waters of the U.S then a Section 404 permit application would need to be submitted to our office. You are reminded that although this proposal does not need a Section 404 permit based on your submitted plans, any revisions to the applicant's proposal may be subject to Section 404. Any impacts to waters of the U.S. are to be avoided otherwise subsequent authorization will be required from this office.

This review is applicable only to the permit program administered by the Corps of Engineers. It does not eliminate the need to obtain other Federal, state or local approvals before beginning work. This proposed project has the potential to place lead shot in the vicinity of two drainage features that have the potential to then transport that material into unnamed tributaries of the Mississippi River. While the activity does not require a Department of the Army permit, it is strongly encouraged that you contact Mike Irwin at the Missouri Department of Natural Resources Water Protection Program, at 573-522-1131, to ensure compliance with any Missouri state water quality requirements.
